Livestock Entries:

Entry fees are not refundable. All entry fees are payable when entry form is made and must accompany the form. Entries to be made on proper entry forms. Entries can only be canceled upon satisfactory proof being given to the Livestock Director that circumstances beyond the control of the exhibitor prevent the exhibitor from showing.

Health Requirements:

Exhibitors from **outside** the Province should consult their local district Health of Animals Veterinarian to determine the appropriate qualifying certificate.

Livestock Rules and Regulations:

1. No overnight sleeping in the Livestock barns will be allowed.
2. The amount of space (height and frontage) allotted Exhibitors for storage of feed and straw and for a tack room will be in relations to the number and nature of the entries and is subject to the discretion of the Livestock Director.
3. Entries close Aug 1 or as posted in each division and must be postmarked no later than that date, as due to restricted space, accommodation will be allotted on the basis of entry received in accordance with above.
4. **Registered name and number** of animal must be on the entry form. Papers to be available for inspection before judging commences.
5. Registration and transfer of animals to be shown must be completed in the particular Herd Books concerned and recorded in the Canadian National Livestock Records or in the Regular Holstein Friesian Herd Books of Canada prior to the closing date of entries at the Exhibition. Foreign entries must also be registered by this date in their respective Foreign Herd Books, recognized by the Canadian purebred Organizations.
6. Animals are to be shown in classes in which Exhibitor's entry form designates. Identification may be required before the animals enter the ring.
7. Committee chairperson will arrange space.
8. Calf Club entries will be charged entry fees if shown in the open classes.
9. 4-H Calf Club member's entries will only be accepted if they are qualified and not in competition with other entries from the same farm or breeding unit.
10. 4-H entries will be judged on a separate program.
11. Exhibitors must bring out their animals for stock judging when requested.
12. All livestock must undergo a Veterinarian inspection and any found with communicable diseases or infections will be refused, as well as other animals that may have come into contact with them and if admitted through an oversight, on discovery of the same, it shall be forthwith removed. The Livestock Director, on the advice of the Veterinarian, is authorized to so refuse any animal that is not in apparent good health.
13. For public and animal safety, all cattle must be halter broken and/or controllable while on the Vancouver Island Exhibition Grounds.
14. **All Livestock vehicles must use Livestock entrance, located on Labieux Road, only.**
15. All bulls two years of age and older must have nose leaders in their noses and neck rope and must have adequate staff for control of such animals. Bulls or any other animal that is unruly and cannot be properly controlled will be disqualified at the discretion of the Exhibitions management. Bulls may not be led in the barn or exhibited in the ring by any person under 14 years of age.
16. Substitutions and Additional Entries:
 - a. Substitutions for health reasons only within any section for single animals in the same class will be permitted on presentation of a Veterinary Certificate covering the animal originally provided.
 - b. The animal offered as a substitute was owned by the exhibitor on the closing date of entries and
 - c. The exhibitor furnished to the Livestock Director the information with respect to the substitute animals required.

17. **Insurance - it is mandatory that all exhibitors shall obtain public liability insurance to protect themselves and to have proof of such insurance available upon request. Such insurance is obtained at nominal cost, consult your insurance broker.**
18. The management reserves the right to eliminate any breed or class where it is considered there is not sufficient competition. The VIEx reserves the right to limit entries where entries exceed the accommodations. The VIEx will be responsible for the first sawdust only in the barns.
19. The VIEx reserves the right to combine classes.
20. The VIEx reserves the right to refuse any entry and to return any entry fee without being liable for compensation.
21. All Livestock are to be on the grounds by 8:00 PM Thursday of Fair Week and not to leave the grounds until 5:00 PM Sunday of Fair Week.
22. **All Exhibitors except 4-H must pay daily gate admissions to the fair grounds, which can be exchanged (with proof of purchase) for an Exhibitors Pass at the Fair Office.**
23. All barns are to be left clean, with bedding cleaned out. Any exhibitor with dirty stalls shall not receive prize money.
24. All payments of livestock prize money will be mailed to postal addresses of the prize winners, as recorded on their official entry form, as soon as possible after the close of the Exhibition.

Cheque to be cashed within 30 days of issue, after which they become NULL AND VOID!

Division B – Cattle

This year the VIEx will host a cattle display featuring cattle of various breeds. Farm community representatives will be on hand to display their cattle and answer questions. Don't miss the Milking Parlour Demos held throughout the weekend in the Agriplex.

Division C – Sheep

If no chair is found then the Division will be changed from entry to display only.

Entry Fee: \$6.50 per class unless indicated otherwise in the class description. All entries received after August 5, 2009 must be accompanied by **double entry fee**. An exhibitor is considered to be the owner of the animals as listed on the CLRC registration papers. In the case of none registered sheep, the person who feeds and cares for the sheep at their own residence is considered to be the owner of record.

Exhibitors are required to attend a brief meeting prior to the commencement of judging at 9:30 Friday morning. Please bring your pedigrees, and any last minute entries and fees.

Judging will commence: Friday, August 21st at 10:30 AM.

Sheep Display Contest: Agricultural awareness is a very important component of today's fairs. Without it, sponsorship of open shows would be nearly impossible. **The VIEx is asking that all entrants decorate their stall area and provide as much educational content as possible.** We will be offering prizes for the best decorated stalls based on educational content.

Rules and Regulations for Sheep:

1. All sheep must be on the grounds by Thursday, August 20, 2009 no later than 10 PM.
2. All sheep must have federally required CSIP tags in place before arriving at the fair. Any animals not so tagged must be removed from the fair grounds.
3. All animals showing in the registered breed classes must be legibly tattooed or double ID tagged in accordance with the Canadian Sheep Breeder's Assoc. rules and pedigrees **must** be present on the fair grounds.
4. All sheep must be registered in the name of the exhibitor. The exhibitor is responsible for having registration papers available for examination prior to the show as well as completing the entry form, paying the entry fee and identifying the handler if they will not be in attendance at the show themselves. (See the entry form) All prize money will be mailed to the exhibitor of record.
5. All sheep breeds recognized by the Canadian Sheep Breeder's Assoc. and registered with the Canadian Livestock Registry may be shown. In addition, there will be a full set of classes for commercial meat and commercial wool sheep. Those breeds having a minimum of 3 breeders and 16 sheep will have their own breed division with full prize money for all classes shown below. Those breeds not having sufficient numbers will be grouped together into one or more AOB (if numbers merit, this could include coloured AOB class) classes at the convener's discretion. Maximum of 9 breeds will be judged.
6. 4-H members are encouraged to compete in the open sheep show; however they must abide by all the show rules. In particular, but not limited to, the ownership requirements, presence of registration papers, and entry deadlines.
7. In the absence of appropriate competition or if animals are of inferior quality, the judge will award only such prizes as he/she feels are merited.
8. All sheep except those shown in the wool classes must have no more than 1 inch of fleece present. Market lambs must have been shorn within the last 30 days.
9. All sheep may be subjected to a veterinary inspection. All animals must be in good health, show no signs of foot rot, ectoparasites or any form of communicable disease. Any unfit sheep must be removed from the grounds and no entry fees will be refunded.
10. Sheep must remain on the fairgrounds until 5:00 PM Sunday. Vacant pens found before 5:00 PM will result in forfeiture of prize money by that exhibitor.
11. Should a question arise as to the age of an animal, the dentition will be the deciding factor.

Double entry fees will be required for entries received within the 10 day period preceding the show date.

Division C-1 Breed Classes

1. Ewe lambs: Full mouth milk teeth. First pair of temporary incisors must be present. All lambs must have been born on the property of the exhibitor by September 1, 2009.
2. Yearling ewes: First pair of permanent incisors must be in place. Second pair of permanent may be in place but the third pair of temporary incisors as well as all other milk teeth must be firmly in place.
3. Mature ewes: Must have passed their second birthday.
4. Progeny: Ewe displayed with lambs she has produced since September 1, 2009.
5. Ram lambs: Full mouth milk teeth. First pair of temporary incisors must be present. All lambs must have been born on the property of the exhibitor by September 1, 2009.
6. Ram yearling or older: At least the first pair of permanent incisors must be fully in place.
7. Get-of-Sire: A group of three lambs all sired by the same ram each of which must have been shown in a previous class. Both sexes must be presented.
8. Breeder's flock: A group of 4 animals all bred and born on the property of the exhibitor, all of which have been shown in a previous class. Both sexes must be represented. Commercial flocks may be shown with the owner's purebred ram which has been shown in a breed class.

Division C-2 Market Lamb

Entry Fee - \$20.00 per lamb

Prize Money – First \$75.00, Second \$62.50, Third \$50.00, Fourth \$37.50, Fifth \$25.00 + 50% of the entry fees paid for this class prorated between the first 3 placing. Animals to be shorn no earlier than 30 days prior to the show with no more that ½ inch of wool. No evidence of testicles can be present and animals are not to exceed 135 lbs live weight.

Division C-3 Special Classes

9. Junior Achiever: No entry fee.
Open to handlers 10-21 years of age. Any age or breed (including commercial) sheep are eligible. The sheep need not to be owned by the handler. All fitting should have been done by the handler. The class is judged on showmanship and knowledge of the handler as well as the conformation of the sheep. The winner of this class will be presented with the Jeanie and Charlie Saunders Perpetual Trophy, plus prorated cash award as listed in the prize list.
10. Little Britches: No entry fee.
Open to handlers 9 years of age and under. As with the previous class all sheep are eligible. Competition based on showmanship and knowledge of the handler with consideration given to their age. Ribbon and prorated cash award as listed in the prize list.
11. Costume Class: Entry fee \$2.00 per entry.
Open to all ages and all types of sheep. (Sheep must have been entered in another class.) Both the handler and the sheep must be in costumes of a similar theme. Consideration will be given to the originality and complimentary relationship of the costumes. Rosettes and prizes to third.
12. Featured Breed Class: No entry fee.
Featured breed will be determined by the total number of sheep of one breed entered in the open show. This year's class will be a pair consisting of two ram lambs and will be judged 50/50 on the individual merits of each animal and the overall quality of the pair. The convener will have available for the public an information sheet including the contact information for (featured) breeders present at the show as well as an area for breeders to post information on the breed. This information will be located near the show ring during show times and moved closer to the barn when the ring is not in use. Rosette and trophy to first and rosette to second.
13. Premier Exhibitor Award: All exhibitors automatically eligible.
Points will be awarded for each of the top five places prorated in relation to the number of entries in the class. Only those classes listed in Divisions C-1 and C-2 qualify for points. Each exhibitor of sheep awarded a breed Championship will receive additional points equal to 10% of their total points in that

breed. Reserve Champions 5%. Exhibitors receiving Supreme Champion awards will receive additional points equal to 20% of their total over all points for the show.

14. Youth Class

Open to yearling ewes of all CSBA recognized breeds owned and exhibited by a youth exhibitor. Exhibitors must not have reached their 21st birthday by August 1, 2009. Animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name. Date of ownership shall be May 1, 2008 or before as shown on the registration papers. All sheep must be handled by the registered owner unless more than one entry is present in the class in which case another youth exhibitor must handle the second entry. Sheep shown in this class may also be entered in the Open Show classes but only as an entry for the same exhibitor. Prize monies and entry fees are the same as the open show breed classes.

Rules and Regulations for Heavy Draft Horses

1. Stabling will be stallions and mares with foals at foot first, then as entries received.
2. Entries must be made on or before entry closing date in order to afford sufficient time to examine entry papers, to correspond with parties when necessary, for correction of errors, omissions, canceling or combining of classes.
3. All entries must be on the grounds not later than 9:00 PM Thursday and remain on the grounds until 5:00 PM, Sunday of Fair weekend. Unless special permission is obtained.
4. The Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee will decide upon the weight division between light and heavy geldings.
5. The show is open to all, but the Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
6. The Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the Rules and correct any error or make necessary alterations in the Rules, Prize List or Catalogue.
7. The Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee reserves itself the power to bar any horse and/or exhibitor from the show rings without being liable for compensation.
8. When in the ring, drivers, attendants and grooms must be neatly and suitably attired. The Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee may, at its discretion, bar any exhibitor from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

9. The Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee reserves the right to cancel any class. Any class with less than three (3) entries, with the exception of the stallion class, may be combined.
10. For Halter classes, a photocopy of each horse's registration papers is to be included with your entry. Failing this, your entry will be returned. (i.e. registered mare or stallion classes.)
11. Definition of a junior is any person under the age of 18 as of January 01 of the current year.
12. All foals must be exhibited on the halter. Mares to be held in a designated area within the ring.
13. Foals to be held in a designated area within the ring while mares are shown at halter.
14. Any horse not sufficiently under control shall be asked to leave the ring.
15. Five (5) minute time limit. To prevent delay we must adhere to a 5 minute time limit between classes, after which time the gate will be closed and the class will begin.
16. In the event of disqualification, no prize money or ribbons will be awarded, with the exception of the team log skid, where log skid rules will prevail.
17. Absolutely no drinking of liquor in the barns or barn area.
18. Whipping, striking, cursing and/or swearing will not be permitted and will result in disqualification.
19. If the number of entries warrant, a division of classes may occur at the discretion of the Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee.
20. Pee Wee Lead Line: entrants must wear helmet and boots, be supervised by an adult. Ribbons for all entrants.

Rules for the Team and Log Skids:

1. When in the ring, drivers, attendants and grooms must be neatly and suitably attired. The Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee may, at its discretion, bar any exhibitor from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.
2. The Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee reserves the right to cancel any class. Any class with less than three (3) entries, with the exception of the stallion class, may be combined.
3. For Halter classes, a photocopy of each horse's registration papers is to be included with your entry. Failing this, your entry will be returned, (i.e.: registered mare or stallion classes.)
4. Definition of a junior is any person under the age of 18 as of January 01 of the current year.
5. All foals must be exhibited on the halter. Mares to be held in a designated area within the ring.
6. Foals to be held in a designated area within the ring while mares are shown at halter.
7. Any horse not sufficiently under control shall be asked to leave the ring.
8. Five (5) minute time limit. To prevent delay we must adhere to a five-minute time limit between classes, after which time the gate will be closed and the class will begin.
9. In the event of a disqualification, no prize money or ribbons will be awarded, with the exception of the team log skid, where log skid rules will prevail.
10. Absolutely no drinking of liquor in the barns or barn area.
11. Whipping, striking, cursing and/or swearing will not be permitted and will result in disqualification.
12. If the number of entries warrant, a division of classes may occur at the discretion of the Heavy Draft Horse Show Committee.
13. Rules for the Team Competition and Log Skids will be posted prior to class.
14. Judges decisions are FINAL.

Light Horse Show Rules and Regulations

1. Any class with 3 or less entries will only be paid 2nd and 3rd prize money. The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any class with insufficient entries. Exhibitors will be notified if possible.
2. No changing stall without the permission of the show office, this will automatically forfeit your stall deposit to the Light Horse Show.
3. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without being liable for compensation.
4. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules and correct any error or make necessary alterations in the rules, prize book or catalogue.
5. Junior B Riders are those riders the age of 15 years or under as of August 31 of Show Year. Green Riders are of any age, must be a beginner rider and must not have shown in any other classes before. The Show Committee has the right to disqualify any rider trying to pass as a Green Rider without the return of their entry fees. Green Riders may not cross entry with any other classes, with the exception of the Game Classes. Parent signature is required for any rider under the age of 19 years of age. Jr. A. Rider must be under the age of 12 as of August 31 of Show Year.
6. Should any question or dispute arise not provided for in the rules, it shall be referred to the Show Committee whose decision shall be final.
7. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judge or judging will be excluded from the competition. Foul language or abuse directed at any Show Official will result in disqualification from the entire show without refund of any entry fees paid.
8. For Halter and Registered classes, a photocopy of the Horses registration papers is to be included with your entry for all Registered Classes.
9. Ponies must be under 14.2HH and under.
10. Vehicles and trailers must not be parked on the Exhibition grounds; they must be parked in the Livestock parking lot only.
11. Exhibitors canceling their entries after the official date for closing of all entries shall forfeit their entry fees, except in case of disability certificate from a veterinarian. This only applies before the cut off. NO EXCEPTIONS.
12. All riders must wear an approved Helmet in English Classes. Mandatory Helmet check will be conducted.
13. All riders must be a member in good standing with the BC Horse Council and must include their valid number on their entry form.
14. Abuse of Horses on the fair grounds will, at the discretion of the Show Committee, lead to the disqualification of the exhibitor in question. All horses doctored artificially or improperly or unfairly prepared or tampered with before entering the ring will be disqualified and asked to leave the Fair Grounds.
15. All prizes must be claimed at the Show Office by Sunday at 5:00 PM or will be forfeited to the Light Horse Show. NO EXCEPTIONS.
16. Any Exhibitor found vandalizing, stealing or tampering with property of the Fair Grounds, other Exhibitors, vendors or the VIEx, will be reported to local authorities and punished by law. The Exhibitor will be disqualified and no entry fees will be returned.

Stall Competition

The Light Horse Show is part of the Agricultural Fair and Exhibitors are asked to decorate their stalls, providing information about their horse's breed, age, sex and previous winnings, etc. They will be judged on:

- Educational content and animal identification – 50%
- Cleanliness, decoration and general attractiveness – 50%

There will be prizes and a \$25.00 1st prize only for the best decorated individual stall.

Rules and Regulations

1. Open to members of 4-H clubs following regulations under the 4-H program, of the BCMAF Public Affairs Branch.
2. No project entry fee, entry deadline August 1, 2009.
3. Non-exhibiting 4-H members may purchase the VIEx 3-day pass or pay gate fee.
4. Club members may enter registered calves, lambs and horses in open class only if their entry meets all requirements of the particular open class and does not exceed the maximum number of entries allowed in the class from one farm or breeding unit. In addition, club members must submit the regular entry form and pay the regular entry fee for the open class.
5. Club members entering other than a project animal will not be allowed to keep such entries in the 4-H barns.
6. All 4-H livestock must be in the place by 9:00 PM, Thursday of Fair week. All livestock except 4-H horses will remain on the grounds until 5:00 PM, Sunday, of Fair week, when they will be released. 4-H horses must be out of their barn by 7:00 PM, Friday, of Fair week.

7. Each 4-H Livestock Club will be expected to designate two members for each eight animals, to look after club entries. Please don't expect other clubs to do this for you.
8. All calves and lambs entered in the 4-H show must be stabled in the 4-H section of the Livestock buildings, unless special permission to do otherwise is obtained from the Livestock Director.
9. All 4-H cattle exhibits must comply with the Agriculture Canada Health of Animals Branch Regulations and Disease Control.
10. First straw bedding will be provided. No other feed or bedding provided.
11. Should any questions arise that are not provided for in the Rules and Regulations, the decision of Executive for the Exhibition shall be final.
12. All 4-H Exhibits to be judged on the Danish System, where there are six or more entries in a class, except the 4-H horse performance, which will place in a straight line up to the sixth.
13. All 4-H livestock clubs must enter the Stall Competition. Dairy, beef, sheep and goat will be judged from Friday, August 21st at 10:00 AM to Sunday, August 23rd at 4:00 PM. Rabbit and poultry will be judged from 10:00 AM Friday August 21st to 4:00 PM, Sunday, August 23rd Horse clubs will be judged Friday, August 21st, from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.
14. Barn space will be allotted on the 'first come, first serve' basis.
15. Due to the shortage of buildings, 4-H horses will have a one-day show to commence at 9:00 AM, Friday, August 21st.
16. Members must exhibit their own project animals in Showmanship classes. Another club member may help with the showing of other project units if help is needed.
17. No 4-H Exhibitor will be allowed to sleep in the barns, but will be permitted to staying in campers, only if parental supervision is provided.
18. All 4-H club leaders are to provide the Fair with a list of their respective supervisors. List should be attached to entry forms.
19. A 10:30 PM curfew will apply to all 4-H members.
20. The 4-H member **must** do any clipping or grooming of a 4-H animal at the fair and it **must not** be by an adult or leader or that animal will be disqualified from competition.
21. All barn walkways must be kept clear at all times. Clipping and grooming chutes and other such equipment must be placed in designated areas.
22. All 4-H regulations will apply for the duration of the fair. 4-H embers are compelled to abide by the S.A.D. rules. The VIEx will not tolerate any violation of these rules. All offenders will be sent home.
23. VIEx will host 4-H dinner on the Friday night of the Fair at 6:00 PM.
