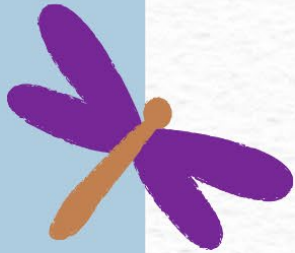

General Information

SERVICES AT BEBAN PARK:

Camping is available at \$28.75+ GST per unit per day (one camper unit one vehicle unit per campsite ONLY). Limited electrical hook-ups are available on a "First Come, First Serve" basis. No water or sewer hook-ups. As far as possible, everything necessary for the comfort of exhibition visitors has been arranged at Beban Park. Administration Office, Police, Fire Protection, St. John Ambulance, Rest Rooms, Pay Phones, ATM's, Information and Food Concessions.

FIRE AND POLICE PROTECTION:

Day and night watchmen are provided for all buildings and various areas within the grounds; every possible precaution is taken to reduce to a minimum the risk and probability of fire. Notwithstanding these precautions, the exhibition will not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage by fire, theft or otherwise. Should the exhibitors require their exhibits be covered by insurance, they should make this arrangement personally.

EMERGENCY FIRST AID:

Tactical Medical Services will provide a First Aid Post on the grounds. Emergency First Aid is provided free of charge; additional services including ambulance fees are chargeable to the person receiving the service.

PARKING VEHICLES: *ON FAIR WEEKEND ONLY*

Since the exhibition has a huge effect on the traffic on Bowen Road, in consultation with the City of Nanaimo and the RCMP, the following Traffic and Parking changes will be in effect:

There will be no VIEx parking access from Bowen Road. ALL VIEx parking will be accessed from Labieux Road only.

The south entrance to Beban Park from Bowen Road will be restricted to Emergency Response, Gate 1 – Boys & Girls Club, golfers and tennis players only. ***Drop offs and Deliveries to Gate #4, Labieux Rd.***

The North entrance to Beban Parkway from Labieux will be ONE-WAY IN. The right lane will be dedicated to parking in the paved lots near the Main Entrance (Gate #2). The left lane will be dedicated to drop-offs, Vendor deliveries, Parks & Rec, Staff and Office, Altrusa Playground and VIP Access.

The BMX Track entrance to Beban Park from Labieux Road will be restricted to BMX patrons and Emergency Response.

The south entrance to Beban Park from Labieux Road will be available for exhibitor and participant parking, livestock deliveries, campground access, livestock trailer parking, drop offs and deliveries.

This plan is intended to reduce the traffic and parking wait time so that everyone will have more time available to enjoy the fair. Thanks for your cooperation and patience in helping us work out the details.

ALL SERVICE VEHICLES MUST BE OFF THE GROUNDS BY 8:45 AM. ALL SERVICE AND LIVESTOCK VEHICLES MUST USE THE LIVESTOCK GATE. SIGNS WILL BE POSTED. VEHICLES ILLEGALLY PARKED ON THE FAIR GROUNDS AFTER 9:00 AM WILL BE TOWED.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS:

- A. No general admission gate will permit vehicular traffic to proceed through the gate, except via gate #4 through the livestock gate. All persons entering in vehicles will be subject to the admission policy stated in item #18 of Rules & Regulations (i.e. all persons entering the grounds must pay gate admission or be in possession of a valid pass)
- B. Parking passes will be issued, upon request, to those exhibitors who wish to park inside the fairgrounds. (Limited amount available. First come, First serve) vehicles may not be parked along barns or adjacent to stalls except as noted in item "E". Passes must be displayed, and entries paid or will be removed. **No camping in these vehicles.**
- C. Under no circumstances will vehicles (except ambulances, police, fire.) be permitted to move within the fairgrounds between the hours of 9:00 AM and 9:00 PM Friday and Saturday and between the hours of 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM Sunday. This rule is for the safety of the public, exhibitors, and animals. Exhibitors who violate this rule may be disqualified or barred from entering in subsequent years as deemed appropriate by the Directors.
- D. No parking will be permitted on the fair grounds in any area except the inside parking area. Limited space is available for trailers, campers and motor homes in the camping area. ***These vehicles will be parked in designated, prearranged spaces and must have a valid, numbered parking pass which will be obtainable at the show office at \$28.75 + GST per unit, per day and will be checked on a daily basis by a VIEx official.*** The spaces are limited in size and will only accommodate one camping unit and a maximum of one vehicle. Permission to park campers and motor homes will only be granted to exhibitors who will remain in the space for the entire duration of the fair. (9:00am Friday to 5:00pm Sunday of Fair Week)
- E. All areas with the exception of the inside parking area and the designated camper spaces are considered Loading/Unloading Zones. Livestock exhibitors are permitted to park in these areas while loading/unloading animals and equipment ONLY. ***Maximum duration of parking in these areas is 25 minutes and must be prior to 9:00 am and after 9:00 pm during the fair. Any vehicle parked in the loading/unloading areas (adjacent to barns, etc.) after 9:00 am and prior to 9:00pm will be towed at the owner's expense.***
- F. Any exceptions of the above rules must be **PRE-APPROVED** by the VIEx board member on duty in the show office located in the center of the grounds in the **LITTLE RED BARN** and will only be granted in the event of an emergency such as an animal illness or injury, etc.

As exhibitors, part of your responsibility is to be familiar with and abide by the following rules and regulations.

VANCOUVER ISLAND EXHIBITION **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. Entry fees must accompany entry forms.** Cheques should be made payable to **Vancouver Island Exhibition Association** and mailed to the respective person as stated in the Division entered. For particulars regarding entry fees, see under each division heading; with exception of Livestock (See Livestock Division Rules)
- 2. Entry Fees are not refundable** in the event of entry being cancelled by the exhibitor.
- 3. Entries must be made on or before the entry closing date** in order to afford sufficient time to examine entry papers, to correspond with parties, when necessary, for corrections of errors or omissions. The Board reserves the right to accept entries later than the advertised date of closing.
- 4. Exhibits must be in place and ready for judging at the times listed under each division.**
- 5. No person will be allowed to enter in competition more than one specimen in any one class except where otherwise mentioned. *This rule does not apply to livestock.***
- 6. All entries in the exhibition must be the bona fide property of (within a minimum 14 days) and made or raised by the exhibitor expect when otherwise stated.**
- 7. No persons shall be allowed to engage the judge in conversation or otherwise interfere in his work during the time the exhibits are being judged. *Those doing so will be excluded from the competition.*** Foul language or abuse directed at any show official will result in disqualification from the entire show.
- 8. Exhibitors must provide for the delivery of their exhibits to the Exhibition Grounds. The Association will not in any case make provision for the transportation of be subject to any expense there of, either on delivery to or return from the grounds. All expenses connected therewith must be provided for by the exhibitor and all freight, express and cartage charges must be prepaid.**
- 9. Exhibits not accompanied by their owners or their agents must be considered entirely the owner's risk and may be addressed to the exhibitor, care of the Exhibition Association, who will receive them at the grounds if all cartage and other charges have been prepaid.**
- 10. The Exhibition will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of the exhibits sent to the Exhibition, but the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them; and should any exhibit or portion thereof be injured, stolen or lost, the Exhibition will give assistance towards the recovery of the same, but will not be liable or make payment for the value thereof.**
- 11. Exhibitors, concessionaires and all other persons are only admitted to the grounds on the understanding that they will cooperate with the Exhibition Association in providing an agricultural fair. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, no suit instituted or maintained against the Exhibition Association, its officers or agents, by or on behalf of any visitor, or any person, firm or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants or employees, having license or privilege to exhibit on the Exhibition Grounds or occupying any space therein.**
- 12. The Exhibition Association shall not be liable for an loss to an exhibitor occasioned by fire, accident, condition of structure, of the negligence of other exhibitors or officials or otherwise howsoever.**
- 13. No prize cards fixed on the exhibits by the judges, or the secretary shall be removed without authorization, otherwise the prize will not be paid.**
- 14. Any article, stand or other equipment left in the buildings or grounds after the close of the Exhibition will be at the owner's risk. The buildings will be open for removal of exhibits after 5:00pm on Sunday.**
- 15. All protests must be made in writing and given to the President before 5:00 pm on the last day of the Fair, with a deposit of \$25.00. The deposit will be forfeited if the objection is not sustained.**
- 16. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion and other exhibits liable to cause damage, accidents or injury to property or to persons coming in contact with them, shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact therewith, and every such exhibitor shall indemnify the Exhibition from and against all claims and demands, costs, charges, and expenses which may incur, suffer or be put to, by reason of any accident or of an reason of any such exhibit, performance or concession not being properly protected there from.**
- 17. Except where otherwise noted in this prize book, *No Exhibit shall be removed from the exhibition until after 5:00 pm on the last day of the exhibition, August 27th 2023.*** Any exhibitor removing exhibits before prize book stated dates/times may forfeit prize money. The owner must present claim checks to the committee in charge before the exhibit is removed.
- 18. *All exhibitors and persons accompanying same must pay daily gate admissions to fair grounds.*** Which can be exchanged (with proof of purchase) and the additional moneys to make up the sum for a 3-day pass at the gate, from the fair office or from any board member.
- 19. Should there not be sufficient funds on hand to pay prizes in full they will be paid pro rata.**
- 20. Vouchers for merchandise offered as prizes must be presented to the donor within one month after the date or they will be forfeited.**
- 21. The Exhibition Association will not be responsible for payment or prizes (special or otherwise) offered by others.**
- 22. Parking areas will be provided as far as possible within the area available in Beban Park. The Exhibition will not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage by fire, theft or otherwise.**
- 23. With the exception of members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, no person will carry or attempt to carry any arms, ammunition or explosives anywhere on the Exhibition Grounds at any time.**
- 24. *No smoking in the barns or anywhere on the grounds.*** As well as refraining from smoking, exhibitors are requested to politely ask any smoker to refrain from smoking in the barn area.
- 25. Exhibitors agree to abide by the rules and regulations set out herein. Failure to comply will render exhibitor liable to being barred from exhibiting in subsequent years, at the discretion of the Executive.**

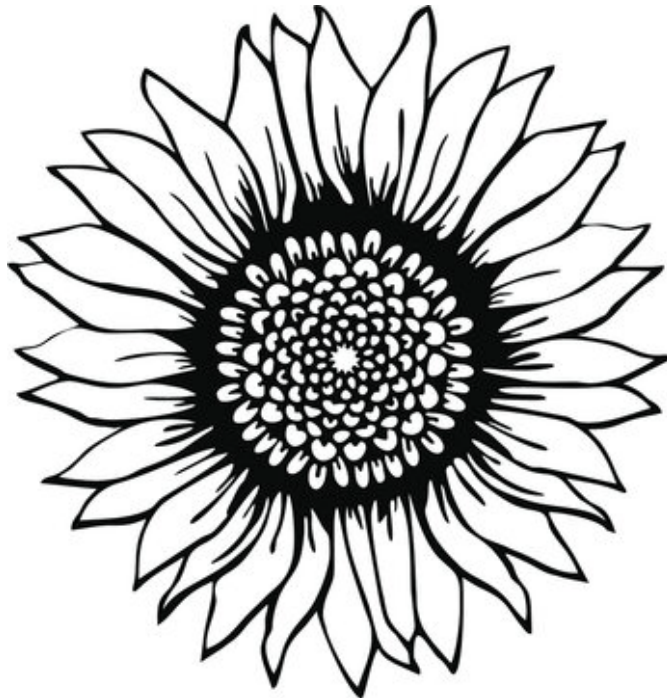

Livestock Entries:

Entry fees are not refundable. All entry fees are payable when entry form is made and must accompany the form. Entries to be made on proper entry forms. Entries can only be cancelled upon satisfactory proof being given to the Livestock Director that circumstances beyond the control of the exhibitor prevent the exhibitor from showing. **Entry form at the back of the book.**

Health Requirements:

Exhibitors from **OUTSIDE** the Province should consult their local district Health of Animals Veterinarian to determine the appropriate qualifying certificate.

Livestock Rules and Regulations:

1. No overnight sleeping in the Livestock barns will be allowed, unless approved by the Livestock Director.
2. The amount of space (height and frontage) allotted Exhibitors for storage of feed and straw for a tack room will be in relations to the number and nature of the entries and is subject to the discretion of the Livestock Director.
3. Entries close August 1st or as posted in each division and must be postmarked no later than that date, as due to restricted space, accommodation will be allotted on the basis of entry received in accordance with above.
4. **REGISTERED NAME AND NUMBER** of animals must be on the entry form. Papers are to be available for inspection before judging commences.
5. Registration and transfer of animals to be shown must be completed in the particular Herd Books concerned and recorded in Friesian Herd Books of Canada prior to the closing date of entries at the Exhibition. Foreign entries must also be registered by this date in their respective Foreign Herd Books, recognized by the Canadian Purebred Organization.
6. Animals are to be shown in classes in which Exhibitor's entry form designates. Identification may be required before the animals enter the ring.
7. Committee chairperson will arrange space.
8. 4-H Calf Club members will be charged entry fees if shown in the open classes.
9. 4-H Calf Club members entries will only be accepted if they are qualified and not in competition with other entries from the same farm or breeding unit.
10. 4-H entries will be judged on a separate program.
11. Exhibitors must bring out their animals for stock judging when requested.
12. All livestock must undergo a Veterinarian inspection, and any found with communicable diseases or infections will be refused, as well as other animals that may have come into contact with them and if admitted through an oversight, on discovery of the same, it shall be forthwith removed. The Livestock Director, on the advice of the Veterinarian, is authorized to so refuse any animal that is not in apparent good health.
13. For public and animal safety, all livestock must be halter broken and controllable while on the Vancouver Island Exhibition Grounds.
14. **ALL LIVESTOCK VEHICLES MUST USE LIVESTOCK ENTRANCE (Gate #4), LOCATED ON LABIEUX ROAD ONLY.**
15. All bulls two ears of age and older must have nose leaders in their noses and neck rope and must have adequate staff for control of such animals. Bulls or any other animal that is unruly and cannot be properly controlled will be disqualified at the discretion of the Exhibition management. Bulls may not be led in the barn or exhibited in the ring by any person under 14 years of age.
16. Substitutions and Additional Entries:
 - a. Substitutions for health reasons only within any section for single animals in the same class will be permitted on presentation of a Veterinary Certificate covering the animal originally provided.
 - b. The animal offered as a substitute was owned by the exhibitor on the closing date of entries and
 - c. The exhibitor furnished to the Livestock Director the information with respect to the substitute animals required.
17. ***INSURANCE – IT IS MANDATORY THAT ALL EXHIBITORS SHALL OBTAIN PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE TO PROTECT THEMSELVES AND TO HAVE PROOF OF SUCH INSURANCE AVAILABLE UPON REQUEST. SUCH INSURANCE IS OBTAINED AT NOMINAL COST, CONSULT YOUR INSURANCE BROKER.***
18. The management reserves the right to eliminate any breed or class where it is considered there is not sufficient competition. The VIEx reserves the right to limit entries where entries exceed the accommodations. The VIEx will be responsible for the sawdust only in the barns.
19. The VIEx reserves the right to combine classes.
20. The VIEx reserves the right to refuse any entry and to return any entry fee without being liable for compensation.
21. **All livestock are to be on the grounds by 8:00 pm Thursday of the Fair Weekend not to leave the grounds until 5:00 pm Sunday of Fair Week. No exceptions.**
22. ALL EXHIBITORS EXCEPT 4-H MUST PAY DAILY GATE ADMISSIONS TO THE FAIR GROUNDS WHICH CAN BE EXCHANGED (WITH PROOF OF PURCHASE) FOR AN EXHIBITOR'S PASS AT THE FAIR OFFICE.
23. All barns are to be left clean, with bedding cleaned out. Any exhibitor with dirty stalls shall not receive prize money.
24. All payments of livestock prize money will be mailed to postal addresses of the prize winners, as recorded on their official entry form, as soon as possible after the close of the Exhibition.

CHEQUE TO BE CASHED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF ISSUE, AFTER WHICH THEY BECOME NULL AND VOID.

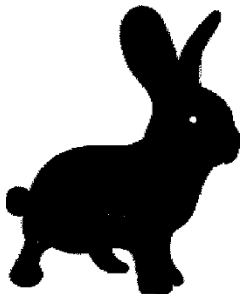

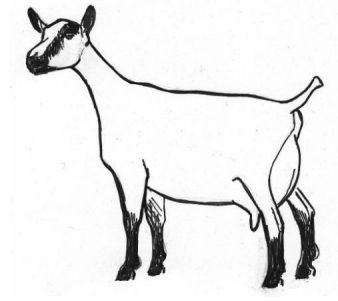
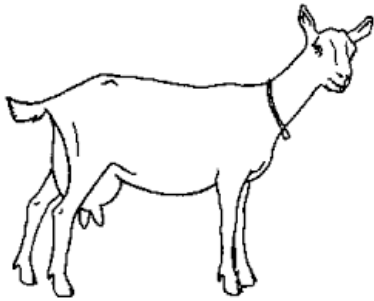

Danish System:

Used in all Divisions for Youth. Each entry is judged according to quality and a standard of work. **They are not compared against each other, but against this standard.** Each exhibit will receive a ribbon: First Place – Excellent, Second Place – Good and Third Place – Worthy. All exhibits will be judged and those not receiving the above will receive Honourable mention or participant.

Composition – May be any combination of fresh and/or treated, dried, or weathered material, plus accessories.

Double & Semi Doubles – Flowers have more than one layer of petals.

Perennials – A plant that lives for more than two years, growing from the same root, bulb or tuber each year, wintering either in or out of the ground.

Single – Flower has a centre with one layer of petals.

Spike – A flower structure with flowers stem less on a common lengthened stalk. Used sometimes where stems of the individual flowers are very short, e.g., gladiolus, snapdragons.

Spray – A branch, bearing dependent branches or flowers.

Variety – Plants within the naturally occurring variant of species that differ from one another in one or more special characteristics.

2. Baking exhibitors should wrap or enclose in a clear plastic wrap or enclose in a clear plastic container with a clear top. (Available at most store bakery departments)
3. Only products of the home kitchens are eligible to compete. Each entry must be made from scratch.
4. On entry per class except where noted.

Guideline for Foods

Cakes – Should have a flat or slightly rounded top, moist, fine grained, slightly glossing surface, fine velvety texture. Does not crumble significantly when cut, is tender, has characteristic, pleasant flavour. All cakes use layered 8” or 9” square pan. Cut cakes into 9 pieces. Display centre in on corner only.

Baking Powder Biscuits – Should have fairly smooth surface, delicately crisp crust with a slightly moist interior, flaky and tender and pleasant flavour.

Quick Breads and Muffins – Should be lightly browned, symmetrical, bumpy, rough surface, tiny holes, not tunnels.

Yeast Breads – Should have smooth rounded top, evenly brown, thin crust, moist interior. Fine even interior texture, light pleasant taste and pleasant aroma.
